DOST trains 4Ps graduates on Community Life Competence Process with Gender Conscientization in Tanauan, Leyte

The Provincial Science and Technology Center (PSTC) in Leyte and the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Tanauan worked together for the success of conducting the Community Life Competence Process (CLCP) with Gender Conscientization on November 3-4, 2022. It was attended by 217 4Ps beneficiaries from Tanauan, Levte of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST)-assisted project in the Province of Leyte entitled "Capacitating 4Ps Graduate Beneficiaries for Science and Technology-based Livelihood Opportunities". The Community Life Competence Process (CLCP) aims to apply Science and Technology (S&T) interventions needed by the communities for components comprising health and nutrition, water and sanitation, basic education and literacy,

livelihood/economic development, and disaster risk reduction/climate change adoption by working hand in hand with LGUs and various stakeholders.

In the CLCP training that lasted for two (2) days held at Tanauan Gym, Tanauan, Leyte, the participants were made to understand the concepts, steps, and tools in relation to DOST's ongoing Community Empowerment through Science and Technology (CEST) program which was all discussed by Dr. Evelyn B. Tablante, the resource speaker and the Gender Conscientization was also discussed by the Gender and Development (GAD) Secretariat, Mr. Aivan Lloyd Calonia, both from DOST Regional Office No. VIII. The discussion involved the

mobilization of all genders to attain the end of gender equality in the community as this has been one of the measures taken by DOST VIII to integrate the gender dimension into the planning and implementation of the DOST-assisted projects in Eastern Visayas.

At the end of the 2-day training, the DOST VIII and the different agencies also shared the programs and services which are being offered to communities in Tanauan and in the region as well. The Leyte Provincial S&T Director, Dr. John Glenn D. Ocaña formally closed the 2-day training with an emphasis on taking up the challenge for community empowerment. He reminded the participants that the DOST in partnership with other government agencies and stakeholders is ready to address poverty reduction and people empowerment through working closely with LGUs in the implementation of various projects and activities.

It is expected that the community will be able to strengthen and enhance further the capability of the 217 beneficiaries to effectively implement the program that envisions to build an empowered, resilient, healthy, safe, and sustainable Tanauan, Leyte alleviating poverty and contributing to the 8-point economic agenda of the current administration.

DOST VIII conducts 4-day Scholarship Caravan in Biliran Province

The Department of Science and Technology (DOST), through the Provincial Science and Technology Center in Biliran led by its Director, Dr. Romeo T. Dignos together with his team successfully conducted the 4-day caravan on November 7-10, 2022 around the Province of Biliran promoting the upcoming 2023 DOST-Science Education Institute (SEI) Scholarship Qualifying Examinations.

Hundreds of Grade 12 students from every Senior High School in the Province participated in the forums. The said activity was aimed at generating more applicants and therefore giving opportunities to graduating Senior High School students this school year to become DOST scholars. The information caravan covered a brief presentation about the DOST, its mandates,

programs, and projects to give the students an understanding of why the scholarships are implemented by the agency. The main discussions, however, focused on presenting the various scholarship programs. The students are also taught how to apply online through demonstrations.

The caravan was conducted at various university and schools in Biliran: Biliran Province State University (BiPSU) Student Center, Tucdao National High School (HS), Culaba National Vocational School, Caibiran National HS, and at Cabucgayan National School of Arts and Trades participated by students from respective areas.

Through the caravan, DOST is expecting more applicants will be able to submit their documents on time so that they can join the face-to-face examinations which will be conducted again after (two) 2 years of being stopped due to restrictions brought by the pandemic.

DOST Leyte-LNU jointly conduct TNA to Farmers' Association in Leyte for potential S&T-Based Interventions

In line with the continuing collaborative relationship between the Leyte Provincial Science and Technology Office (PSTO) and the Leyte Normal University (LNU), a local state university based in Tacloban City headed by its President, Dr. Evelyn B. Aguirre, the mentioned institutions agreed to jointly assist remote communities to improve their standard of living by providing access to government programs and services that will enhance local industries through technology transfer and community organizing activities.

LNU proposed that their currently assisted community at Brgy. San Miguelay, Sta Fe., Leyte was the initial beneficiary for a collaborative project. On 13th of October 2022, DOST Leyte and LNU jointly conducted the Technology Needs Assessment (TNA)

with the farmers' community of the abovementioned barangay. The TNA is an assessment tool used to identify technology-related strengths and weaknesses of a client enterprise or people's organization by assessing its core business functions and the results of the analyses will be used as a guide for determining appropriate assistance.

The DOST Leyte Team was led by its Provincial S&T Director Dr. John Glenn Ocaña. On the other hand, the LNU Team was led by the Director of its Extension Services Dr. Lowell Quisumbing joined by College Extension Coordinators. The consultation session with the barangay folks yielded the fact that most of them rely on rice production as their main source of income. Only

two (2) croppings can be realized in a year, meaning only twice a year that the farmers expect major cash inflow. Unfortunately, the area is also beset with flooding problems once in a while which negatively impact the hapless farmers' income. It was then agreed that the potential interventions would be to improve the farmers' resilience against the challenges they are facing in their agricultural industry by infusing appropriate technologies and by bringing in more stakeholders such as the Department of Agriculture (DA) and the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI).

PHIVOLCS installs Tsunami Early Warning System in Lawaan, Eastern Samar



The Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (PHILVOCS) of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST), in coordination with the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Lawaan, Eastern Samar and the Samar Provincial Science and Technology Office (PSTO), has successfully installed a Tsunami Early Warning System (TEWS) at the center of Lawaan municipality on November 7, 2022.

Led by Engr. Angelito G. Lanuza, Supervising Science Research Specialist of Seismological Observation & Earthquake Prediction Division (SOEPD), the DOST-PHIVOLCS team also conducted a 3-day orientation of the TEWS and Tsunami Evacuation Planning Workshop to various officials of the coastal barangays and LGU representatives of Lawaan to fully prepare the community in a tsunami event from November 7-9, 2022.

Officials from PHIVOLS-Palo and Provincial S&T Office in Eastern Samar were also present during the activity.

Aimed at providing and capacitating the LGU of an effective tsunami monitoring and communication system, the alerting system could also monitor all tsunami events that may affect the Philippines and is expected to generate timely issuance of tsunami advisories and warnings to communities in the locality.

the Community Empowerment thru Science and Technology (CEST) project funded by DOST. It aimed to capacitate MABA to standardize the process in the production of tahong-based products (e.g. bottled tahong and tahong crackers) and ensure products are safe for consumption.

The DOST-Samar food safety team beginning with its director, Ms. Rosella L. Gopo conducted the training on food safety, followed by the Good Manufacturing Practices (GMP) training conducted by Ms. Emelyn A. Maglahus, SRS II. On the other hand, an actual processing of bottled tahong was demonstrated by the MABA processors on the second day during the writeshop on Sanitation Standard Operating Procedures (SSOP) that was conducted by Ms. Isabelita M. Pamposa with Ms. Gopo and staff, Ms. Sheila Mae Pica.

Next step for the association after the series of trainings and other technical assistance provided to them, is the application for License-to-Operate (LTO) from Food and Drug Administration (FDA), to enable them sell products outside the local markets and penetrate wider customers in the national market, hence augment their income and help sustain their business operation. In the long term, the DOST-Samar is seeing an empowered and resilient tahong community through the DOST-CEST program.

The Department of Science and Technology Region VIII (DOST VIII), launched the first DOST Grassroots Innovation for Inclusive Development (GRIND) Program in Eastern Visavas and Memorandum of Agreement Signing with Leyte Normal University (LNU) and Eastern Visayas Consortium for Industry, Energy, and **Emerging Technology Research and** Development (EVCIEERD), entitled: **Grassroots Innovations Imperatives** and Nuances: Community Empowerment thru Science and Technology (CEST) Interventions and Qualification Model. The launching was held at LNU on November 18, 2022. As the lead proponent of the program, the Leyte Normal University headed by its President, Dr. Evelyn B. The program will reveal how grassroots innovation of the marginalized sectors of the Province of Leyte was developed, underscoring

The study will culminate with a baselining component, providing empirical bases for CEST interventions. In his message, Engr. The Department of Science & Technology (DOST)-Northern Samar, along with the Department of Trade & Industry (DTI)-Northern Samar Provincial Office and the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Laoang, Northern Samar, conducted the Technology Transfer Training on Nipa Palm Sugar Production to Brgy. Tarusan's nipa farmers who are also nipa wine (lambanog) producers. This one-day training was conducted at Brgy. Tarusan, Laoang, Northern Samar on October 5, 2022. The training introduced a viable source of sustainable livelihood to the nipa farmers in the community.

Ms. Joanna Marie F. Ramos and Mr. Romnick A. Enriquez, who visited Northern Samar for the first time, as the resource persons from the DOST-Industrial Technology Development Institute (ITDI) in Bicutan, Taguig City, trained 22 participants on Food Safety, Introduction to Good Manufacturing Practices (GMP) and on Sugar Production from nipa palm.

Nipa sugar is a healthier and safer option for overweight, diabetic and

health-conscious consumers. It is found to be a good alternative to cane sugar because of its minerals and low glycemic index. The production of an alternative sweetener from nipa sap has been further improved by using a sanitized system for the collection of nipa sap and an optimized process of

converting nipa sap into sugar, as presented and discussed by the resource speaker.

These trainings aimed to help the farmers enhance their production and improve the quality of their products.
